No 1: DESCRIPTION AND SCOPE OF CORPS INSTRUCTIONS

Aim

1. Corps Instructions.
 - a. Corps Instructions are designed to be an authoritative source of information governing operation of Corps in purely domestic matters.
 - b. Corps Instructions are provided to cover those subjects peculiar to the Corps and which are not specifically covered by other instructions or orders.

Scope

2. Corps Instructions will be issued as required to provide information on the following subjects:
 - a. Corps ceremonial;
 - b. The RAEME Corps Fund;
 - c. Dress regulations affecting the Corps which are not specifically covered by the Army Standing Orders For Dress;
 - d. Awards specific to the Corps;
 - e. Corps Badges, Signs, Flags, Insignia, The Corps Banner and Centrepiece as well as other distinctive items;
 - f. General Corps matters relating to history and tradition;
 - g. Recognition of Service to the Corps,
 - h. Mess etiquette within the Corps; and
 - i. Information to guide the Corps in building prestige and maintaining tradition.

Presentation

3. SO2 Corps is responsible for the administrative procedures relating to and distribution of Corps Instructions.

Distribution

4. SO2 Corps - RAEME will distribute copies of and amendments to Corps instructions directly to entitled persons and units. The scale of issue is as per the distribution list which accompanies the Corps Instructions.

Conclusion

5. The good management, morale, tradition and standing of the Corps depends on the wide dissemination of, and compliance with, the policies relating to the Corps. Corps Instructions play an important role in assisting in these matters. All members of the Corps are to be acquainted with the contents of Corps Instructions and are to comply with both the letter and spirit of these Instructions.
