Introduction

1. The Principle Chaplains Committee - Army has authorised a prayer for the Corps of the Royal Australian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers, hereafter known as the Corps Prayer.

Aim

2. The aim of this instruction is to present the Corps Prayer, and describe its meaning and use.

The Prayer

Inspire us, members of the Corps of Royal Australian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers, with the spirit of service, that as thorough craftsmen, we may, by the work of our hands, serve faithfully and effectively, though Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Description

3. The Corps Prayer ascribes to God the energies symbolised in the RAEME Badge, and asks for their spiritual counterparts to mark our officers and soldiers, and so produce a Corps conspicuous for its shaping of both materials and men.

4. The Corps Prayer is to be used on such appropriate occasions as Corps religious ceremonies or observances.
